

## RESULTS RELEASE FOR MUST A, B AND POSTGRADUATE STUDIES

A recent meeting of the Senate this week approved results of examinations for MUST A, B and Postgraduate students.

Students with outstanding fees balances will not be able to view their grades. This measure is in accordance with the university's policy on financial obligations. However, students who are on MUST Endowment Fund or are beneficiaries of the Higher Education Students Loans and Grants Board will have access to their grades regardless of any outstanding fees. All Undergraduate Students are, therefore requested to access their results through their portals and download a PDF results sheet.

Meanwhile, students are advised to take note of the subjects in which they will sit for Supplementary examinations scheduled from Wednesday 17<sup>th</sup> July 2024. The timetable for these examinations will be released soon by Examinations Office. Results for ODeL students will be communicated by the end of Friday 12<sup>th</sup> July 2024.

#### Fees payment

The university does not receive cash or use any mobile money accounts, as such, all fees should be deposited into university bank accounts. Students will be required to submit proof of payment, by way of deposit slip on arrival on campus. Students can also pay through the online payment platform available on our webpage (www.must.ac.mw).
